## The Dam Gets A Facelift...by David Bradbury

The dam life extension project is complete except for a few small items. All of the concrete and structural work is done. Next year, we plan to build a new wood gate to replace the existing one. The new dam configuration will **provide** three times the water flow over the spillway. This will provide lake level control during a normal summer without opening and closing the gate. This spring

we have not had to open the level without opening the gate to control the lake level.

The Lake level today is about two inches above the projected summer level. In a normal season the lake level should stay within plus or minus two inches of the summer level. When you put The dam repairs can be your dock in this season you should set the level accordingly.

Regulating the lake water

gate eliminates erratic level changes. This provides a more natural water flow downstream. During the loon nesting season a stable water level improves chick survival.

seen from the water. Do not go near the spillway. DO NOT swim near the dam or wade as you could be caught in the current.

#### **Capital Fund Drive – Needs You!...**by Steve Center

Expect additional funding from the 2011 drive to be at least \$40,000

At our annual meeting in July of 2010 we approved moving forward with a significant capital fund effort. Frankly, it was not an option if we were going to rebuild our dam. During 2010 we had a self-imposed mandate to move rapidly as the dam repair and payment was to be completed in the fall of 2010. For that reason, our board members each elected to seek out six to ten property owner contacts, primarily on the basis of neighborhood or personal knowledge. The total amount of those contacted represented less than 50% of property owners with lakefront access.

Our fund drive schedule runs from July, 2010, through October, 2011. We decided in the fall to put it on hold and restart in June, 2011. We have been very successful to date with the average contribution over \$1,000 per property owner with a typical payment schedule of \$100 or \$200 per owner for ten years.

Our board of directors believes every property owner with access should

have both the opportunity and the responsibility to contribute to the vitality of our lake and watershed.

We have established a line of credit with a local bank. We are working on another major project and because of the timing of payments it will take a decade for us to receive all of the money which has been pledged.

These are trying times and any "crisis funding" from governments, grants, etc. will be more and more difficult if some catastrophic event were to strike. Preliminary research would suggest that a lake the size of ours should work toward establishing a reserve of at least \$75,000 to have available immediately should something serious occur. Fear of invasive species such as milfoil is paramount in the minds of all of us currently, and I'm sure many of you have read about the seriousness of problems with some lake not too far from us and the fact that they do not have the necessary financial resources. We have the momentum and we urge everyone to participate in the capital fund drive.



The second phase of this drive will take place over the spring and summer, and we very much need six to eight individuals who are willing to work on this program. We have excellent materials and will provide instruction and leadership. Please call Steve

# Paine Neighborhood/Watchic Lake Watershed Remediation Effort by Steve Center

In our last newsletter, we published an article which described a major project of the Association in conjunction with Town leadership, most impacted property owners and several environmental entities. We discussed the fact that we viewed this as both complex and serious with potential negative impact on the entire Watchic watershed if not corrected. Since mid-December we have identified an area of approximately 500 acres on the Route 113 side of the lake, have hired an engineering firm and conducted an aerial survey which allows us through computer simulation to determine what is causing the issue and, therefore, give us information as to how to

remedy it. We have had exceptional support from the most impacted landowners which is very wide ranging including active participation and financing. We have also received excellent support from the Town and we made a decision to move forward. On June 4<sup>th</sup> at 9:00 a.m. at the Kiwanis Clubhouse we will be holding an important meeting where our engineering firm will lay out a remedial plan. All property owners are invited. We would expect to go out for various bids on the work to be done at that time Our goal is to have it completed by fall.

From a realistic perspective, when we undertook this project we did so because we viewed it to be of critical importance to the long term health of our lake. We realized that activities on this project had suffered several stops and starts over an eight to ten year period, and we proceeded with no greater than a 40% to 50% belief that we could accomplish what we were seeking to do. We can say today that we are well beyond the point where anybody expected us to be.

# Prior Year Accomplishments:

Samples were collected in the Fall of 2009 and Spring of 2010 and submitted to Katahdin Labs for independent analysis. Overall test results showed that the water was in very good condition at the time the tests were performed.

Detailed test results were compiled and presented at the annual meeting on July 10, 2010 by Eben Joslyn.

Secchi disk readings were

taken numerous times throughout the year and indicated that water clarity continued to be well above average.

Test results were uploaded to the VLMP website and we are presently waiting for the VLMP to post them to their website. Once this is completed, we will have a link added to the WLA website so that results may be reviewed online.

## Current Year Accomplishments:

Additional samples were taken on **Saturday**, **May 14**, **2011**. Consistent with the last two years, these samples will be taken to Katahdin Associates for

independent analysis.
Results will be reported at the annual meeting and will also be made available on the Website.

#### Objectives for 2011-2012

To continue testing on a regular basis to ensure that the quality of the water is not being compromised.

To identify additional individuals willing to participate in sample collection, testing, and the ongoing education of all property owners to help us in our efforts to preserve the water quality of Watchic Lake.
