It's hard to believe that summer is over and Thanksgiving is just around the corner!

### Membership – Did You Do Your Part?

While up from earlier years, 2016 membership is flat with 2015. As of October 31<sup>st</sup>, 107 of the 256 lake properties were members, meaning that 55% of properties have not contributed to efforts to keep the lake, the loons, and the fish healthy, nor did they contribute to the repair of the dam and other remediation projects. Fortunately, donations by the Town of Standish, DEP, and other contributors helped support this year's activities.

### Recap of Major WLA 2016 Activities

Early in 2016 the WLA presented the "Watchic Lake Risk Assessment Report" completed by a third party environmental firm called FB Environmental. Much of our work this year was to address items raised in this report.

Water Quality Monitoring: Starting in the spring we began to gather additional water quality data including dissolved oxygen, temperature, Secchi disk transparency, total phosphorus, total nitrogen, total organic carbon, chlorophyll-a, alkalinity, pH, and color. We also similarly sampled the Page and Paine Brooks areas. Three dissolved oxygen loggers attached to the buoy help automate data gathering. **Invasive Plant Screening and Reporting:** In July, a group of 10 WLA board members and volunteers surveyed Watchic Lake for invasive plant species – none were found. As a member of the Maine Volunteer Lake Monitoring Program, we are asked to submit an inventory of the native plants found in the lake. Runoff Remediation at Major Risk Sites: Working closely with road associations and Maine DEP, the WLA made significant progress in remediating runoff at Hi-Vu Drive, the Dorothy Drive boat launch, and Watchic Rd 19. Loon Monitoring: Thanks to the efforts of Kim and Steve Lajoie, plus Cathy Watson and Wendi Rodrigueza, Watchic Lake participated in the 2016 Loon Count, which is sponsored by the Loon Project at Maine Audubon. Consistent with earlier years, there are two pairs of loons on the lake, who as of September are bringing up three healthy chicks. LakeSmart Gold Award: With eight new LakeSmart properties on our lake in 2016, we have met Maine Lakes Society targets for their prestigious Gold Award. With over 15% of properties with LakeSmart awards, Watchic Lake is the first lake in Southern Maine to have achieved this award. Thank you to all the property owners who have invested time, effort, and money to create a property that reduces runoff and otherwise protects the lake.
