
2020 Annual Meeting - Online July 11 at 10:00 am

Water Quality Update

During 2019, the water quality of Watchic Lake remains good and is substantially unchanged from data collected over the previous 3 years (2016-2018). While water quality is good today, Watchic Lake remains at risk over the long term. Nutrient laden run-off from storms (especially mega-storms) can enter the watershed and lake causing negative changes in the lake's water quality. 2020 Watershed Protection Plan – EPA Approved!

The WLA, with help from FB Environmental, has completed updating its 1999 watershed protection plan for Watchic Lake and the Watchic Lake Watershed. After many reviews with the US Department of Environmental Protection, and the Maine Department of Environmental Protection, our plan has been approved. EPA and DEP approval of this plan is a major milestone, as it unlocks access to Maine DEP and US EPA Section 319 grants for Watchic Lake property owners, road associations, and the town of Standish for up to ten years.

Over the past month the WLA and FBE have worked with the Town of Standish and road associations to identify runoff remediation projects suitable for Section 319 Grants. Our grant application was completed mid-May requesting DEP/EPA support of up to \$125,000 of projects on and around the lake. We will learn if our application has been approved in September of 2020, and if approved projects can be completed during 2021 and 2022.



Loon Update



As of May 25, 2020, there appear to be four loons on the northwest end of the lake and two loons on the east end. No nests have been established but the water in the inlet on the east end is still high. This may force the pairs to nest close to each other which causes deep drama between the pairs. If you notice them chasing each other across the lake, stabbing their beaks into the water, or breaching from an underwater attack, these are likely territorial arguments.

In Case of sick or injured loons: A) Do Not Pursue, B) observe from 200 feet, C) take pictures for rescue info. Then: 1) Call Diane Winn at Avian Wild Bird Rehabilitation Center in Freedom Maine (207) 382-6761, 2) contact Kim or Steve Lajoie (603) 493-

2594, 3) State Warden Office (207) 287-8000. You will be advised on what steps to take. In case of harassment (i.e. loons being chased by boats) call the Standish Police Dept. **The leading cause of loon death in Maine are boat hits** – please watch out for diving loons!

We plan to participate in the Annual Maine loon count at the end of July. The state collects and tracks this data for research and information for maintaining a healthy loon population in the state.

Spring 2020 Dam Opening

This year the dam was closed March 26 (shortly after ice out) to raise the lake to the summer full pond level. Full pond is generally reached in about two to three weeks depending on the weather. Ice out occurred on about March 23 this year, a bit earlier than previous years. The dam is operated and maintained by the Watchic Lake Association dam committee. Route 113 Culvert Replacement and Road Closure

This summer, contractors will remove the existing concrete structure on Rt 113 near Watchic Rd 19 and replace it with a new precast concrete wildlife-friendly culvert box. They will also replace the guardrail on the approaches.

Work is planned to begin mid-July and scheduled for completion between mid-August and November 1 (ideally before). Maine DOT expects Rt 113 to be closed for 28 days during this time. Maine DOT will send out closure notifications 10 days prior to closure. There may be temporary day time lane restrictions with flaggers before and after the 28 days of closure. The marked detour will use Ossipee Trail/Rt 25 and Sokokis Avenue/Rt 11. More details can be found on the Maine.gov/mDOT website under Watchic Bridge Replacement.
