Protect our Lake from Aquatic Invasive Species

Watchic Lake is fortunate to have healthy waters, which support high-quality habitat for fish and wildlife as well as endless opportunities for outdoor recreation.

Unfortunately, our lake, as well as the fish, wildlife, and recreation it supports, are threatened each year by introductions of fish, plants, diseases, and other aquatic invasive species that compete with and displace native natural communities.

Once an aquatic invasive species has established in a body of water, it is extremely difficult for it to be eradicated. These efforts are costly, often risky, and not always successful and introductions have the potential to change our natural places and the way we enjoy them forever.



Prevention is Key! Clean. Drain. Dry. Every Time!

- Clean off visible aquatic plants, animals, and mud from watercraft, motor, trailer, and equipment before leaving water access, and before entering the lake.
- **Drain** water from watercraft, motor, bilge, bladder tanks, live well, and portable bait containers away from the water before getting to the lake.
- Dry completely before reuse

Much more from Maine IFW on keeping out invasives.

New Law Protects Loons from Lead Poisoning

Maine recently passed <u>LD 958</u>, a bill to expand protections to Common Loons from lead poisoning. Loons ingest a striking amount of fishing tackle that is either lost or left behind, or is in fish that have ingested tackle. This law closes a loophole in Maine's lead fishing tackle laws that allowed for this painted gear in our state.

This new law phases out the use and sale of small-sized painted lead jigs. The sale of such jigs will be banned by Sept. 1, 2024, and

the use by Sept. 1, 2026. You can turn in your lead jigs and receive \$10 off new gear. See "<u>Trade in Your Lead</u>" for more details.
